## Annotating the Text: Guidelines and Strategies to follow...

*Directions*: Whenever you read a text, use these strategies to help remind you of what you have read. Remember to make short notes (like you would in a text message to a friend) on the margin **whenever** you make a mark on the text.

| Proper nouns         | Put a box around all new characters or proper nouns  |
|----------------------|--|
|                      | Circle all words you don't know and then go look it up or define it by using context clues!  |
| Important<br>Details | Underline important details you find in the text. Anything you underline must be referenced/commented on in the margin (note why you underlined it!) |
|                      | If it is a long section that you want to underline, use a straight vertical line next to the section instead.  |
| [Main Idea]          | Use brackets to identify the main idea of each section/paragraph and paraphrase the main idea in the margin  |
| © LOL                | Use smiley faces or text message speak to help identify your feelings/reflection on something  |
| ????                 | Put a questions mark next to anything that confused you and note your question   |
| W/C<br>(+)(-)        | Put a "w/c" above any meaningful word choice and label it (+) positive or (-) negative   |
| ☆                    | Put a star wherever you find evidence that you may later cite  |
| <b>→</b>             | Put a double arrow next to any key term that is being defined for you  |
| ~~~~                 | Squiggly lines under figurative language/literary devices; then identify the type  |
